At the Grand Slam title, he has won 10 titles, including Wimbledon and the US Open, and is the all-time list. He has also won 10 titles in other Grand Slams, including Wimbledon and the US Open.

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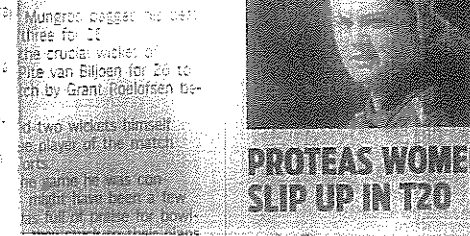
