

Indomitable Serb dominating the Australian Open

Novak Djokovic was the favorite to win the Australian Open men's singles title, and he was not disappointed. The 27-year-old Serb dominated the tournament, defeating Rafael Nadal in the final to claim his 11th Grand Slam title.

Djokovic's performance was nothing short of remarkable. He won his opening round match in straight sets, followed by a dominant display against Roger Federer in the quarterfinals. In the semifinals, he defeated Nadal, who had won the Australian Open in 2005 and 2007.

The match between Djokovic and Nadal in the final was a classic, with both players showcasing their exceptional skills. However, Djokovic's superior fitness and mental strength proved to be the deciding factor. He won the match in four sets, 6-4, 6-4, 6-7(5), 6-4.

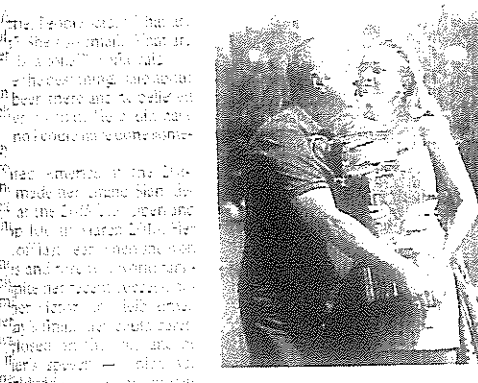

Madison Kenin celebrating her victory at the Australian Open. PHOTO: REUTERS

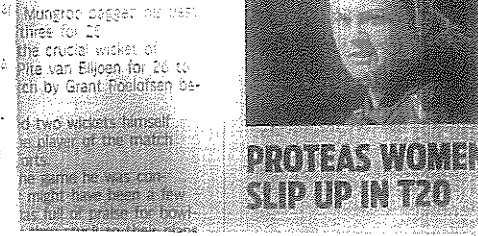
Dolphins bowl a sniff

The Dolphins need to make significant changes if they are to improve their performance in the future. This includes a focus on developing a more consistent batting lineup and a more balanced bowling attack.



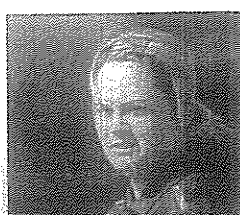
